Principles

It is our policy that all children should wear clothing that is in keeping with our school ethos. We take pride in our school and believe that uniform is an essential part of our school identity. We therefore expect parents to support our school's dress code. We provide a complete list of the items needed for our school uniform below. All items can be purchased from the official school uniform provider, Price & Buckland, and most non logo items are freely available to purchase.

**Aims:**

Our aims are based on the belief that school uniform;

- Promotes a sense of pride in the school
- Engenders a feeling of community and belonging
- Is practical, safe and smart
- Identifies the children with the school
- Is not distracting in class (as fashion items might be)
- Makes children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance
- Is regarded as suitable, and good value for money, by most parents

Our colours are emerald green, grey/black and white and the uniform is as follows:

Boys:

School emerald green sweatshirt, with or without school logo.

School white polo shirt, with or without school logo or a white cotton shirt

School emerald green fleece with or without school logo

School emerald green book bag with school logo (Phase 1 pupils only)

Grey/Black trousers (not combat or skinny design) or plain black/grey shorts

Socks – white, grey or black

Girls:

School emerald green sweatshirt or cardigan with or without school logo

School white polo shirt with or without school logo or a white cotton blouse

School emerald green fleece with or without school logo

School emerald green book bag with school logo (Phase 1 pupils only)

School tights should be grey or black

Grey/black skirt, grey/black trousers, or grey/black pinafore dress

Emerald green gingham dresses may be worn in the summer terms

Socks – white, grey or black

For PE all children need:

School house colour t shirt, with or without logo

School gym bag

School black PE shorts

A tracksuit (needed during Autumn and Spring terms for outdoor PE)

A pair of daps

A pair of trainers

Long hair should be tied back on days when your child has PE lessons

Footwear:

Black, leather shoes with a flat heel (girls may wear plain black leather boots with a flat heel). We recommend shoes that are quick and easy to fasten; laces should only be worn by children who can tie them. These shoes are NOT to be worn for PE.

Jewellery:

We do not allow children to wear any jewellery or wrist bands other than one stud in each ear (these should be removed or taped over for PE if newly pierced). A watch may be worn if appropriate. Nail varnish and temporary tattoos should also not be worn.

Make up, cosmetics and hair:

Make up and cosmetics are not considered appropriate or consistent with our school uniform. The school does not permit such products to be worn by any children, unless there is a specific event for which the Head has given permission. Children should come to school with their natural hair colour.

All clothing and footwear should be clearly labelled with your child's name on it. We cannot be responsible for any school uniform that is lost in school.

Enforcement

We recognise that there are occasions when uniform is lost, damaged and or needs to be replaced and that pupils may need to come to school in alternative clothing. In such circumstances the class teacher should be informed.

However, if your child's uniform does not meet with the schools requirements:

- A letter will be sent home reminding parents of the school's expectations regarding uniform.
- Alternative and appropriate uniform, including footwear will be provided for the children to wear in school.
