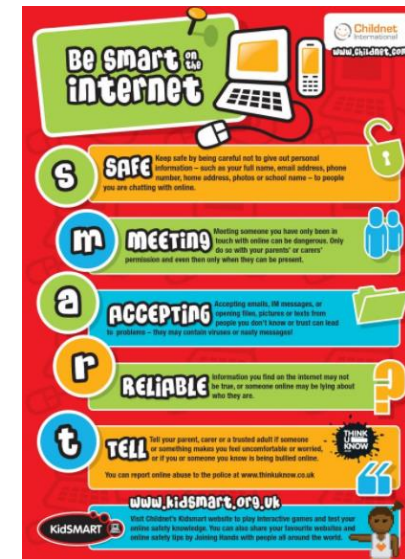

Our main concerns right now

- Children taking photos/videos of themselves and sharing them on social media, Youtube etc.
- Children sending insults/mean messages to others.
- Regarding both these issues...children acting in a way they would never do if the person were stood right in front of them.



Explicit videos and photos

A young person is breaking the law if they:

- **take an explicit photo or video of themselves or a friend**
- **share an explicit image or video of a child, even if it's shared between children of the same age**
- **possess, download or store an explicit image or video of a child, even if the child gave their permission for it to be created.**



Explicit videos and photos

There are many reasons why a young person may want to send a naked or semi-naked picture, video or message to someone else.

- **joining in because they think that ‘everyone is doing it’**
- **boosting their self-esteem**
- **flirting with others and testing their sexual identity**
- **exploring their sexual feelings**
- **to get attention and connect with new people on social media**
- **they may find it difficult to say no if somebody asks them for an explicit image, especially if the person asking is persistent**

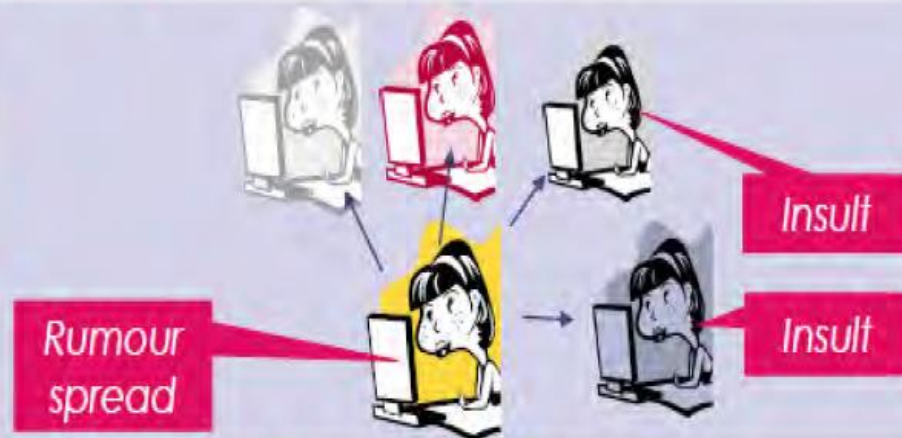
Bullying or friends falling out?

Reveal private information (where you live, school etc.) Photos that Unknown friends, sexual or inappropriate images, easily screenshotted, third-party image savers.

What to watch for

Privacy settings, location settings, easily links Instagram, snapchat accounts etc. Explicit content, streams.



What can you do?

- Approve every app on your child's phone.
- Follow your gut instincts if something feels off with your child.
- Teach self-monitoring to your children
- Encourage your children to use technology, including their social media accounts, for good
- Find out what is popular in your region, different apps catch on in different locations
- Have regular discussions about phone use, apps, and social media with your kids
